## **Meyersche Stollen, Aarau**



In 1791, Johann Rudolf Meyer started to build a system of galleries to provide his dyeing factories with fresh water and later to produce energy with a water wheel. By now, 2km of these galleries are known. We will have the opportunity to visit this interesting example of early industrialisation guided by the archaeologist Helène Klemm.

The galleries are uneven and wet (we will have to walk in water). You should be sure-footed and not afraid of narrow passages. You need wellingtons, clothes that may get dirty, shoes and clothes to wear after the visit (there will be a possibility to change clothes), a plastic bag for the dirty boots and clothes and a torchlight.

The guide will be paid by the club. Donations are welcome to help maintaining the galleries. We will meet at the bicycle stand in front of the catholic Pfarrhaus (at the corner Laurenzenvorstadt / Poststrasse). After the visit, we can go for a drink or a meal at a nearby restaurant.
