Sempach



This is the place near where the Swiss sorted out the Habsburgs on 9th. July 1386, thanks to the bravery of a Mr. Winkelried. Before that the Habsburgs had pawned the city to local lords who bled it dry and caused the city to seek an alliance with Lucerne to rid themselves of the burden.

We will be given an insight into the history of this pretty little town and be shown the numerous historical buildings, together with an account of their significance and history. Right up to the present day, including what to do with your naughty daughters!

We meet by the fountain in front of the town hall you will find on the left when you walk through the town gate (pictured). There is a free car park nearby between the road (Luzernerstrasse) and the lake. The bus from Sempach station drops you right outside the town gate.

It is a fair distance away, so why not make a day of it. Lake Sempach is in a very pretty area of low hills with the Titlis and the Pilatus as a backdrop, and of course there is the bird sanctuary and walks along the lakeside.
